
### Ways to do the church-wide Acts Bible Study

## Jerusalem accepts the Gentile mission and Herod's plans are thwarted

The experience of Pentecost happened to Gentile believers in Caesarea and Peter baptized them in the

name of Jesus. The witnesses to this event included Jewish believers from Jerusalem. But when Peter returned to Jerusalem, the church headquarters, to report on this marvelous development in the Gospel, those who still believed that only Jews could be saved criticized him and he had to tell the story of the Holy Spirit's confirmation to them as well, and they accepted his word.

Meanwhile, the Jews driven out of Jerusalem had moved northward up the coast, preaching the Good News of Jesus to Jews and baptizing new believers at the same time as believers from the island of Cyprus and Cyrene in North Africa had come to Antioch in Syria to preach to the Greek-speaking Gentiles. The apostles in Jerusalem sent Barnabas to confirm them and he sought out Saul (Paul) in Tarsus and brought him to Antioch to preach with him. When a need arose among the church in Jerusalem, the church in Antioch took up a collection for them.

Herod was angry about the growth of the church and killed one of the apostles and imprisoned Peter. But the Holy Spirit freed him and the witness of the church continued to bring many to faith in Jesus. Herod went up to Caesarea to discipline people coming to faith along the northern coast, but was struck dead.

- When the Holy Spirit is at work, there is no stopping it!
- Keep telling the story to whomever will listen. God creates faith in those who hear the story of Jesus
- Those who believe keep learning and growing in faith
