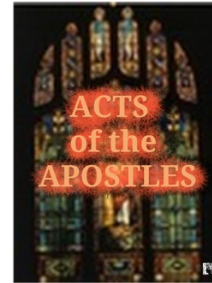


Ways to do the church-wide Acts Bible Study

Missionary Journey #3, Ephesians are baptized by water and the Holy Spirit, an evil spirit fights back, Passover in Philippi, Paul continues teaching and says final goodbye to Ephesus, and heads for Pentecost in Jerusalem

Paul discovers that baptism by water and the Holy Spirit had not yet reached everyone in Ephesus, so they believed in Jesus and received the Holy Spirit. Paul stayed there and taught in synagogues and lecture halls so that both Jews and Gentiles heard the Gospel. God gave Paul the power to perform miracles.

People trying to cast out evil spirits in their own name discover that the name of Jesus is more powerful. Many sorcerers repent and follow Jesus.

Paul went from city to city preaching and teaching for hours and days on end. People were dying to hear him. He commended the Ephesian believers to those who would follow him and encouraged them to remain faithful.

- Even where the Gospel has been preached, there are some who have not heard it
- Spreading the faith entails risk and suffering
- God gives power to those who believe.
- Leadership transitions are difficult.
