
Ways to do the church-wide Acts Bible Study

Jesus appears to Saul and the Church grows

Saul, who was guarding the coats of those who stoned Stephen, was full of zeal against the followers of Jesus. Round 'em up and kill 'em, was his motto.

But God had other plans. The risen Jesus stopped Saul in his tracks and changed the course of his life.

Saul's witness to Jesus Christ was confirmed by the community of apostles, but his abrasive manner stirred up conflict in Jerusalem, so the apostles sent him elsewhere. Where there is disunity with regard to the Gospel, the church cannot grow.

Under the leadership of the apostles, the church grew as both Jews and Gentiles heard the story of Jesus and believed in Him as Lord and were baptized.

It was a big step when Peter and other disciples from Jerusalem experienced the Gentiles coming to faith in Jesus by the work of the Holy Spirit. Now salvation was not only for the chosen people, the Jews, but for anyone who trusts in Jesus.

No one was expecting this change, but there is no arguing with God!

- God is full of surprises!
- Watch out for traditions that may be idols God may knock them over
- Be prepared to welcome those who are different from you
- Be bold in telling the story of Jesus
